A Note from Our Supervisor

Greetings All,

Here are a couple of timely things we'd like to share with you:

The extended warm weather has made fall clean-up quicker and easier, but it has also brought on drought conditions. Although the weather forecasters have advised against burning leaves or yard debris, our local fire companies have been busy with brush fires. So, as you will see below,

the county has declared a Burn Ban until November 30th. Please respect the ban; hopefully the fall rains will come soon, and the drought will end without further property damage or injury.

With fall also comes election season. We have received numerous complaints in the last few days of missing election signs. In recent years this was something that happened in other communities, not in ours. While our community may not always agree on state or national issues or candidates, we have always respected each other's right to express ourselves and to hold a different opinion. It's possible that some or all of this activity is creeping in from other areas. The important thing for all of us to remember is the election will be over soon and, as a community, we can re-focus on the things we share rather than those that divide us.

The 2025 tentative town budget is moving forward for final review and approval at the November 12th board meeting. The budget is flat with no tax increase expected this year. Rising costs were offset by a judicious use of surplus funds, as well as town board and staff efforts to identify efficiencies to keep costs down while providing equivalent or better services. The proposed budget is posted on the website and available at the Clerks' office.

Also on November 12th, a draft of a Short Term Rental (STR) regulation will come before the town board. The draft will be posted on the town website on or before November 8th and copies will be available at the Clerks' office. There will be a board discussion of the draft at the meeting with public comment accepted *at the end of the meeting*. If the board substantially agrees with the draft, it will go to a Public Hearing on

December 9th. It is the intent of these regulations to address health and safety issues associated with the operation of STRs and to balance the rights of property owners to open their homes to short-term rental use with the rights of other homeowners who wish to enjoy the rural and residential character of the town.

As the year ends, we begin to think about staffing and preparations for the coming year. We have identified three key volunteer openings which are listed below with a link for more information. The remaining days and hours for early voting are the following:


